Dr. Jörg Skriebeleit is a historian, cultural theorist, exhibition organizer and author, and Director of the Flossenbürg Concentration Camp Memorial. He studied at Eberhard Karls University Tübingen and Humboldt University in Berlin and received his PhD at the Center for Research on Antisemitism at the TU Berlin (Prof. Wolfgang Benz) with *Erinnerungsort Flossenbürg, Akteure, Zäsuren, Geschichtsbilder* (2009). His publications on cultures of memory and museum theory and practice include *Das Außenlager Bayreuth des KZ Flossenbürg: Wieland Wagner und Bodo Lafferentz im "Institut für physikalische Forschung"* (2003) and *Erinnerung ausstellen* (2011). He is director of numerous exhibitions and projects including "What Remains—The Aftermath of the Flossenbürg Concentration Camp," awarded the Bavarian Museum Prize 2011/2012 and a special commendation from the European Museum of the Year Award 2014, and co-created the recently established memorial to the victims of the Munich Olympics Massacre of 1972. He serves as advisor to numerous memorial and museum projects including the Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe in Berlin and has most recently become one of the advisors for the establishment of a museum at the former Płaszów Concentration Camp in Kraków
