3. “Scripture and the Enemy” program

Unfortunately, it was not possible to prevent the overlap in time with our “Extracanonial Traditions” conference in Regensburg – but still, we are very excited about our Centre for Advanced Studies being represented in Cambridge!

4. “Horologia” workshop from July 18-20 in Regensburg

On July 18-20 a workshop on "The Early History of the Byzantine Liturgy of the Hours and the Horologion" will be co-organised by our *Centre for Advanced Studies*. The early history of the Byzantine Liturgy of the Hours is particularly obscure: although significant progress has been made in recent years by the edition and study of key sources, we are far from a coherent picture and a scholarly consensus on the early development, which was specifically intricate on the one hand because of repeated exchange and complex relations between Jerusalem, the wider Palestinian and Sinaitic context, and Constantinople, on the other hand because of the great variety of ecclesial and monastic institutions involved. Since manuscripts in various languages of the Byzantine world emerge only relatively late, have travelled or come from the periphery, also questions about the possibility, condition, and limits of inference to earlier periods and other regions are inevitable.

The envisaged workshop takes advantage of a fortunate coincidence that will lead to the presence of several protagonists of the research in Byzantine liturgical history in Regensburg (through a number of Fellowships of our *Centre* and of the Humboldt foundation, the DFG-Graduate training group on "Pre-Modern Metropolitanism" and a temporary position likewise funded by the DFG). Notable is also the cooperation with the University of Oslo, where a major project in the field is located.
